“The Secret Sauce to a Happy Life”

When we gathered in February over lunch and questions, you generously shared with me your thoughts, concerns, and hopes. As you told me how you see the mission of Zion, and what you find important in our life together as a congregation, among the most frequent responses included the word “service.” *“Serve the Lord. Serve the community. Serve world-wide.”*

You understand that following Christ means serving others in his name; feeding the hungry, helping the poor and vulnerable, are not pleasant options, but are central to what it means to be a follower of Christ.



And you have learned from serving that the greatest joy and satisfaction in life comes not from what you receive, but from what you give. In serving you receive more joy than in being served.

It is an old story, but appropriate. The Jordan River flows through the Sea of Galilee; water flows in, water flows out. This lake is alive with fish and wildlife, a source of abundance. The Jordan ends by flowing into the Dead Sea. Nothing flows out. The only way water has of leaving the Dead Sea is by evaporating. This lake tries to keep all the flow to itself. It is called the Dead Sea for a reason. Little lives in it; the water is far too salty to drink, or even to support most life.

Try to capture and keep all that comes to you and you wind up like the Dead Sea—empty of life and too toxic. The life which flows through, sharing as freely as it receives, remains healthy.

If you give freely, you find that you also receive freely. If you try to hold onto everything, you find that life becomes stale and toxic and lifeless. Helping others turns out to be a major source of joy for ourselves. Todd Stocker says 'helping others is the secret sauce to a happy life.'¹

Albert Schweitzer said: *"I don't know what your destiny will be, but one thing I do know: the only ones among you who will be really happy are those who have sought and found how to serve."*

This is one of the most important secrets to a happy life: you find happiness not by what you receive, but by what you give. Serving others in the name of Christ returns to you blessings far more abundant than what you give.

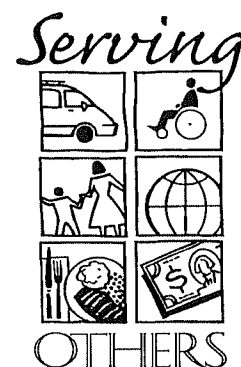
The Bible says, 'give and it will be given to you, full measure, packed down and running over. The measure you give is the measure given to you.' Someone else has put it this way: 'you cannot out-give God.'

Service is the secret sauce of the happy life; it is what makes the difference between dry and flavorless or abundant and full of life. Service has long been a hallmark of Zion. From helping to establish a hospital to helping the homeless, feeding the hungry, Bridging the Gap; you understand how significant it is that you live out your faith by serving others in the name of Christ.

Thank you for being a congregation who so passionately see service to others as an important part of how you live out your faith. Your dedication to serving others is an important part of my joy in serving with you.

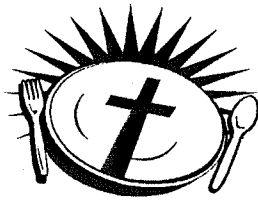
Adult Sunday School meets at 8:45 a.m.

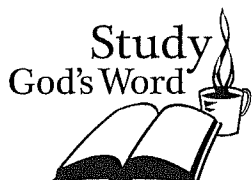
NOIZ Nites for Families is for all ages, any size or shape of family—intergenerational activities for EVERYONE! Take a MINUTE—come to NNF!

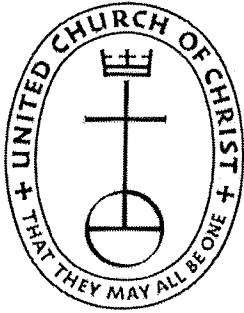

At first glance, that might seem like out of place advice for a money book. But if you think about it, Mr. Russell's advice has to do with setting priorities and then letting money decisions follow in obedience to our priorities, rather than letting the money demands set priorities for us. It is a question of who is going to be in control. Was it Ben Franklin who said, "**Money makes a fine servant, but a poor Master.**"

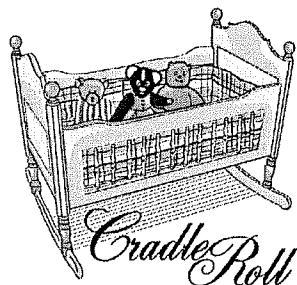

1864 – 2014

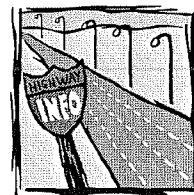

“Launch out into the deep...”

Luke 5:4a

River of Life

It is a bright October morning as we climb aboard a bright blue boat with red trim for a journey down the Congo River. It looks like a small house set on four hollowed-out tree trunks. Written in red letters across her front is “Bateau Ambulance”— ambulance boat. The river is breathtaking, life-giving. At scheduled intervals, the river carries a medical team from the Bolenge Hospital, a Global Ministries partner, to villages along its shore that are otherwise cut off from health care. The entire village is at the river’s edge to greet us. Getting up the riverbank is tricky, but we manage, encouraged by the warmth and joy of the people.

Following the river for some yards are dwellings and a small chapel/school. The villagers have given up their homes for the hospital while the medical team is in town.

Next to the chapel is a tent, a surgical theatre tent where they have been operating since 3:00 AM with the most basic equipment and what sterilization they can manage. They will be there until they can see to the line of patients waiting most of the day under a large tree.

We are introduced to Dr. Yoursen Bosolo Ekula, the Congolese physician who coordinates medical services from the Bolenge Hospital, including the ambulance boat and other Bolenge clinics throughout region. Later, in a video interview, Dr. Bosolo Ekulaw offered these words of thanks:

“We are grateful and thankful to Global Ministries, and pray that our God will bless you. And that Global Ministries will continue to have the necessary funds/ means to help us complete our dream that this hospital and health center become an important teaching resource in this region of the Congo. God bless you, Global Ministries, and thank God for your partnership in this dream.”

Rev. Elizabeth Clement recently traveled to the Democratic Republic of the Congo for Global Ministries. She served as French translator and interpreter for seminary pastors from Haiti visiting the Congo who were there exploring a collaborative partnership.
