Building Block Or Stumbling Stone

Ask the stone, "Who are you? What is your purpose in life?" One stone says, "I am a rock. Too hard to allow a single grain of wheat to grow on me, too rough to sit upon, too cold and hard for sleeping. Good only to stub the toe and skin the knee."






Annual Giving Statements


KONDJEL COMMUNITY CENTER

Scholarships For Ministry Preparation

It's not easy to train a pastor, and it's especially not easy to pay for seminary education. How can we make sure our future leaders get the support they need while they are preparing for ministry? Find out what new and exciting project we're doing in Iowa to help create scholarship aid for our members-in-discernment!



It is expensive to train ordained clergy. Sadly, as time has gone on the burden of paying for education has

shifted from the denomination to the student, leaving many seminary students and pastors deeply in debt.

This isn't a sustainable trend that will lead to a healthy future for our UCC congregations. To address this issue in Iowa, the Iowa Conference UCC Church has established a new Iowa-exclusive special offering that will go to creating direct scholarship aid for our seminary students.




This Offering Is Called Funding Future Leadership: Scholarships For Ministry Preparation, and it will be taken on January 15, 2017.

Aspiring leaders are taking big financial risks so they can serve the needs of the church, so we as a church should do more to help them in their time of need. Think about this: There are 168 churches in the Iowa Conference. If every church donated \$100 to Funding Future Leadership, we would have \$16,800 in scholarship aid to give away. If every church donated \$250 we would have \$42,000, and if we had seven applicants and all were given the same award each student would get \$6,000!

When we all come together for the common goal of taking care of tomorrow's leaders today there are many great things we can do. I invite all churches to please do what they can to support this offering. Thank you.



Turning Stumbling Blocks Into Stepping-Stones



An interesting excerpt written by Lynette Hagin from Faith Library... I thought it was relevant as with every New Year, there are obstacles. Obstacles that

with the help of God, can be turned into stepping stones!

The faith walk is not a walk of ease. It's not always fun to endure life's problems. We would probably rather go through life on "flowery beds of ease." But that's not the way life works. We live in an imperfect world with imperfect people, and life is not going to be easy all the time.

God never promised that the Christian life would be free of tests, trials, and adversity. Now what do we do when life brings problems our way? What should be our response? There is a saying, "When life gives you lemons, make lemonade." Lemonade is pretty good—just add a little sugar to it and it's wonderful! So when life's problems come, we can go to God with them and let Him turn

them around for good.

Climb On Those Bumps!

That reminds me of a story about a little boy who was leading his sister up a mountain path. The way was not easy. Finally the little girl said, "Why, this isn't a path at all! It's too rocky and bumpy!" To this her brother replied, "Sis, the bumps are what you climb on!" You may think, "Hey, I've had a whole lot of bumps in my life.

Maybe I'm going to climb really high!" That may be the case, because the enemy loves to throw his biggest bumps in the paths of those who he knows are going to be great successes for God.

So instead of allowing those bumps to become stumbling blocks, use them as stepping-stones! In my own life, I've always tried to take that attitude concerning problems. I say, "I won't let bumps cause me to stumble. I'm going to step higher and higher until I climb over the top of those bumps and obstacles."

God doesn't promise to remove every obstacle from our path. But He does promise to help us overcome them and climb higher in spite of them.

Difficulties can help us climb higher if we'll use them as stepping-stones. Too often, though, we only want to complain about them. Sometimes we may try to kick them out of the way or jump over them. Or more often, we try to go around them. But when we finally get around one, there's sure to be another bump in our path.

When facing these bumps, it's easy to want to turn around and go another way. But we don't have to quit or give up, because we can turn stumbling blocks into stepping-stones!
