-Earning Heaven-

JESUS LOVES METHIS I KNOW FOR THE BIBLC TELLS ME SO. Americans are especially hard-working people. We build great things: empires, businesses, churches, fortunes. And sometimes we forget, and let that attitude of hard-work to earn our own way slip past the church doors, and into our faith.

The Psalmist knew: we are God's children even before we were born. While God was forming us in our mothers' wombs, we were already God's children. What we did or failed to do after that

did not change that simple fact. We are, and always have been, God's children. All that was left for us to do is to recognize who we are, and turn our faces toward home.

Karl Barth was certainly one of the most prominent theologians and Biblical scholars of his day. He spent a lifetime studying, writing, and explaining the intricacies of the Incarnation of God in Jesus Christ. He wrote a library full of books, using words and concepts that cause the best scholars to struggle, and threaten to cause the brain of one Tennessee seminary student to implode.

All those words; all that study, all those unimaginably complex theological concepts; Karl Barth was at the pinnacle of honor for theological wisdom. Near the end of his life, a reporter asked him if he could sum up all the volumes of books he had written. Could he condense all those high thoughts into one sentence?

Barth answered, "Jesus loves me, this I know; for the Bible tells me so."

And Jesus also loves you.


The First NOIZ Nites of The Year Will Be Wednesday October 4th

NOIZ Nites is an all-church event! Bring your family, neighbors, and friends! It will be a fun time!






ZION ELDERS -Welcome New Members-


SQUARE DANCING -All Church Event-
